
MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY AT SHEPHERD UNIVERSITY

The minimum cumulative GPA in order to associate with a chapter is 2.75 on a 4.00 scale on all high school coursework for new and entering students and is a 2.5 on a 4.00 scale on all undergraduate coursework for returning Shepherd University students and transfer students.







RECRUITMENT NIGHT BREAKDOWN

Values Night

When: Monday, September 9 Check-In Begins @ 8:00 PM

Where: Ram's Den, Student Center

Attire: Casual

During this round, you will visit each of the three Panhellenic sororities for 20 minutes at a time. The purpose of this round of recruitment is to introduce potential new members to all of the social sororities in our Greek community, learning more about their sisterhood and each of their values.

Philanthropy Round

When: Tuesday, September 10 Check-In Begins @ 8:00 PM

Where: Ram's Den, Student Center

Attire: Casual

Our Greek community places a high priority on philanthropy and service. On this evening, you will visit with all three of our Panhellenic sorority chapters to learn about their national philanthropic organizations as well as the local community service projects they participate in throughout the school year. This round will give you the opportunity to gain insight into what we are passionate about and how our chapters are working to make the world a better place. While attending this round you will also receive a financial transparency statement that goes over the financial commitment expected of members in each sorority.

Sisterhood Round

When: Wednesday, September 11 Check-In Begins @ 8:00 PM

Where: Ram's Den, Student Center

Attire: Casual

During the Sisterhood round, you will again visit all three sororities. The fun and entertaining atmosphere during this round of recruitment makes it a favorite for both potential new members and sorority members. You will be able to interact with sisters and learn how each sorority values sisterhood. This round will give you a deeper look at the personalities of the women in the sorority as well as the women as a whole.

Preference Night

When: Thursday, September 12 Check-In Begins @ 8:00 PM

Where: Ram's Den, Student Center

Attire: Dressy/Semi-Formal

Preference Night is open only to women who receive invitations to attend. While you may receive invitations from all three chapters, you may only visit your top two sororities on this night. This round of recruitment is the most special because you are invited to be part of an intimate chapter ceremony. At the end of this evening's rounds, you will be asked to rank the chapters that you visited during Preference Night and indicate whether you would be willing to accept an invitation for membership if it is extended.

Bid Day

Friday, September 13

Bid Day is the last day of the recruitment period. This is the day that invitations to join sororities are extended. Your Recruitment Counselor will inform you of the time and place to meet and receive your invitation. At a Bid Day celebration and reveal, you will meet your new member class and your new sorority family.

Important Note:

To be eligible to receive a bid, all Potential New Members must attend at least two of the first three rounds of Formal Recruitment.



Am I obligated to join a chapter if I attend recruitment?

Absolutely not! Just because you attend recruitment events or receive an invitation to join a sorority, it does not mean you are obligated to join. Formal recruitment is an opportunity to explore Panhellenic sorority life. If you decide it is not right for you, you may withdraw from the process any time before signing the Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA). However, if you do choose not to accept a bid after you have signed the MRABA, you will be ineligible to join another NPC organization until the next formal recruitment period. Once a member has completed the membership education period and has been formally initiated into a chapter, she is no longer eligible to join any other NPC chapters.

Can I join more than one NPC organization?

Though you will get to know all of the NPC organizations through the recruitment process, you can only accept one bid from a single NPC organization. There are other Greek letter organizations on campus that are based around academic concentrations, professions, or community service. Students are able to join both an NPC organization as well as one of the aforementioned service or professional Greek-letter organizations.

Does everyone who attends Formal Recruitment get an invitation to join a chapter?

Most of the women participating in formal recruitment are invited to join a chapter at the end of recruitment. However, the number of women allowed to join each chapter each year is capped at a percentage of the total number of women who signed MRABA forms. Therefore, while we try to find a home for everyone, participating in formal recruitment does not guarantee a bid for membership. It is possible to go through recruitment and not receive a bid to join a sorority.

Does my sexual orientation factor into me being offered a bid?

No! In Panhellenic, we pride ourselves in embracing all those who identify as women, regardless of race, religion, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, etc. Our organizations select members based on who you are, not whom you are attracted to.

What if I am not a "typical sorority girl"?

There is no such thing. As you meet the women of our Panhellenic community, you will find diverse ranges of looks, interests, talents, backgrounds, faiths, and abilities. We are united by being women interested in connection, sisterhood, and service.

POTENTIAL NEW MEMBER BILL OF RIGHTS

Every Potential New Member has:

The right to be treated as an individual.

The right to be fully informed about the recruitment process.

The right to ask questions and receive true and objective answers from recruitment counselors and members.

The right to be treated with respect.

The right to be treated as a capable and mature person without being patronized.

The right to ask how and why and receive straight answers.

The right to express opinions to recruitment counselors.

The right to have inviolable confidentiality when sharing information with recruitment counselors.

The right to make informed choices without undue pressure from others.

The right to be fully informed about the NPC Unanimous Agreements implicit in the Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA) signing process.

The right to make one's own choice, decision, and accept full responsibility for the results of that decision.

The right to have a positive, safe, and enriching recruitment and new member experience.

Your Recruitment Counselor, the Recruitment Team, and the Panhellenic Executive Board will ensure these rules are upheld during recruitment. TERMS TO KNOW

ACTIVE

The term used to indicate a sorority or fraternity member who has been formally initiated into the chapter.

Alumna, Alumni, (Plural: Alumnae)

An initiated member of a fraternity or sorority who is no longer in college. Alumna (female), Alumnus (male), Alumnae (females), Alumni (males and females)

Bid

A formal invitation to join a sorority or fraternity.

Chapter

The term used to refer to each local collegiate group of an inter/national sorority. Shepherd University has 3 sorority chapters that participate in recruitment.

Continuous Open Bidding (COB)

The period other than formal recruitment when Panhellenic sororities may acquire new members.

Informal Recruitment

A formalized period of Continuous Open Recruitment that takes place in the spring semester.

TERMS TO KNOW CONT.

Initiation

The formal ceremonies by which new members complete membership into a chapter and receive full membership benefits. This process differs for each chapter.

Legacy

A woman whose mother, sister, or grandmother (in some cases) is an alumna or active member of a sorority. No sorority is obligated to offer a bid to a legacy. Further, potential new members are completely free to choose the sorority of their own preference.

Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA)

A document each PNM fills out and signs immediately following Preference Night stating her membership preferences. The PNM ranks the sororities she would accept a bid from in order of preference. This is a binding agreement meaning the PNM is willing to accept a bid from any sorority listed on the MRABA.

Panhellenic Council

This term refers to all members of the 3 National Panhellenic Conference sororities at Shepherd University.

Panhellenic Executive Board

An organization comprised of representatives from sororities at Shepherd University who act as the governing body for NPC sororities.

Philanthropy

A national and/or local charity/organization that a sorority sponsors, donating time and money through service to promote human welfare.

Quota

The total number of new members that each sorority may select during Formal Recruitment.

Recruitment Counselor

A Panhellenic representative who assists PNMs during the recruitment process. The recruitment counselors completely disaffiliate from their own sororities to provide objective support during recruitment.

Recruitment Group

A group of potential new members led by a recruitment counselor.
